

UNITY — TRADITION 12

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

Recovery — Step 12

Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

Service — Concept 12

The Conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserve be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of governments, and that, like the Society it serves, it will always remain democratic in thought and action.





New Business

- Holiday Office Hours: Closed for upcoming national holidays; open limited hours Dec. 24th-Jan. 1st.
- **Southeast Regional Forum:** Motion for Service Board to cover travel costs for Office Manager to attend Forum passed with substantial unanimity
- **Store Policy Review:** Previous policy at Central Office Policy had been no returns, exchanges, or refunds; with addition of gift card technology, this policy can be amended in certain situations: with receipt, within two (2) weeks of purchase, items like new, at discretion of manager, for store credit only
- **Phone Call Incident, Nov. 15, 2024:** Phone calls made repeatedly to central office and hotline (28 total calls between 11:36am and 2:19pm) with demands for manager's and trustees' personal information, inquiries about salaries and who oversees payments, threatened a civil lawsuit to "hold someone responsible" for the A.A. organization having "ruined his life"; did not understand our service structure. We did not file a police report, and the individual has not called again since. Call log documented for security purposes.
- **Outreach for Service Board Participation:** Discussion to make a flyer with announcements, available service positions, and more explanation about what Service Board is and does; will include flyer in Bulletin
- Central Office Backer Program: Needs to be overhauled; tabled for next month
- Big Deep South Inventory: (from member-at-large) No longer the only event in this area or at that time of year; event venue costs have increased significantly; event planning seems to continue to repeat previous years without revisiting some of these underlying issues. An inventory process could help to find solutions for some of the ongoing challenges and confusion surrounding the event.

Concept XII Checklist from G.S.O.

Long Form: General Warranties of the Conference: in all its proceedings, the General Service Conference shall observe the spirit of the A.A. Tradition, taking great care that the Conference never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds, plus an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principle; that none of the Conference Members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any of the others; that all important decisions be reached by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy; that, though the Conference may act for the service of

Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government; and that, like the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in thought and action.

Long Form: And finally, we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all.

Summary: Spiritual substance of anonymity is sacrifice. Subordinating personal aims to the common good is the essence of all Twelve Traditions. Why A.A. could not remain a secret society. Principles come before personalities. One hundred percent anonymity at the public level. Anonymity is real humility.

4. Do I ever try to get a certain A.A. group to conform to my standards, not its own?

6. Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition-or belie it?

7. Do I do all I can do to support A.A. financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine subscription?

8. Do I complain about certain A.A.s' behavior—especially if they are paid to work for A.A. Who made me so smart?

9. Do I fulfill all A.A. responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?

10. Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give A.A. critics real ammunition?

II. Should I keep my A.A. membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of A.A. so attractive that other drunks want it?

12. What is the real importance of *me* among more than a million A.A.s?

OUR THREE LEGACIES

UNITY — TRADITION 11

Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.

RECOVERY — STEP 11

Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God *as we understood Him*, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.

Service — Concept 11

The trustees should always have the best possible committees, corporate service directors, executives, staffs, and consultants. Composition, qualifications, induction procedures, and rights and duties will always be matters of serious concern.

Tradition Eleven Checklist from A.A. Grapevine

Long Form: Our relations with the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think A.A. ought to avoid sensational advertising. Our names and pictures as

A.A. members ought not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed. Our public relations should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. There is never need to praise ourselves. We feel it better to let our friends recommend us.

Summary: Public relations are important to A.A. Good public relations save lives. We seek publicity for A.A. principles, not A.A. members. The press has cooperated. Personal anonymity at the public level is the cornerstone of our public relations policy. Eleventh Tradition is a constant reminder that personal ambition has no place in A.A. Each member becomes an active guardian of our Fellowship.

Concept XI Checklist from G.S.O.

Long Form: While the Trustees hold final responsibility for A.A.'s world service administration, they should always have the assistance of the best possible standing committees, corporate service directors, executives, staffs, and consultants. Therefore the composition of these underlying committees and service boards, the personal qualifications of their members, the manner of their induction into service, the systems of their rotation, the way in which they are related to each other, the special

rights and duties of our executives, staffs, and consultants, together with a proper basis for the financial compensation of these special workers, will always be matters for serious care and concern.





By requests from our regional fellowship members, we have assembled a printed meeting booklet. In an age of mobile devices, QR codes, and screen domination, we hope this printed guide supports an increased accessibility of our meeting list to members of Alcoholics Anonymous across all ages, backgrounds, and levels and preferences of tech usage.

In the 64 pages of this booklet, we have listed the nearly 600 in-person and online meetings hosted across eight districts (D12, D17, D18, D19, D20, D21, D24, D25). We have also included components of the "Meeting in a Pocket": readings, prayers, and topics that can help support a meeting among any two or three alcoholics gathered in the name of recovery and a Higher Power.

We will be refreshing and reprinting this booklet on a quarterly basis. Because meeting information does change regularly, we cannot guarantee all printed meeting info will be exactly accurate at all times. Though we do hope our efforts demonstrate a willingness to provide information to newcomers, long-timers, and all recovering alcoholics in between, wherever they are.

given by groups in your area, and go. If you're timid, take someone newer than you are.




Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.
