Central Office Manager; 4 DCMs/District reps; 18 Group Service Board Reps/GSRs; Several Visitors; 3 via Zoom

Note: Last names included for GNO Service Board Trustees due to regulatory requirements for board meeting minutes and financial matters.

Welcome: Meeting called to order at 6:30pm by Andrea H. (Chairperson); Started with Serenity Prayer.

Elections

Facilitated by Area 27 Secretary Ron Z., following the Third Legacy Procedure for voting. 27 voting members present in-person and via Zoom. Voting in-person by paper ballot; on Zoom by verbal vote or via chat. 18 votes needed for a 2/3rds majority. Job description for each role was read aloud, including role requirements, sobriety requirement, etc., and each member standing for a position presented their service resume experience before the vote.

Secretary - Four (4) members willing and able to stand for the position: Jim R., Rene M., Colyn N., Kyle N.

- 1st Vote. 2/3rds majority was attained.
- Rene M is elected as Secretary and Trustee of the GNO Service Board.

Treasurer - Four (4) members willing and able to stand for the position: Jim R., Rene M., JonG., Colyn N.

- 1st Vote. No 2/3rds majority attained.
- **2nd Vote.** No 2/3rds majority attained. Members with less than 1/5th of the vote removed from the voting ballot. Jim R. and Charlie H. remain.
- 3rd Vote. No 2/3rds majority attained.
- 4th Vote. No 2/3rds majority attained.
- Motion on floor to "go to the hat". Motion seconded and passed with substantial unanimity.
- Charles H is elected as Treasurer and Trustee of the GNO Service Board.

Chairperson - Three (3) members willing and able to stand for the position: Jim R., JonG., Tara C.

- 1st Vote. No 2/3rds majority attained.
- **2nd Vote.** 2/3rds majority was attained.
- James R is elected as Chairperson and Trustee of the GNO Service Board.

Officer Reports

Chairperson: Andrea H. welcomes new Service Board Representatives in attendance and accepts all SBR forms provided, to keep on record at Central Office going forward.

Secretary: Notes by Acting Secretary Jim Y. Minutes available for review on website within a week of meeting; May 2025 Meeting Minutes approved.

Treasurer: Monthly financial report from CPA available on website. Report approved with substantial unanimity. Fiscal year ends in June, so full-year fiscal report will be available at next month's meeting and will be provided to the incoming Treasurer for the upcoming FY25-26 budget.

Central Office Report: Carolyn H. - Full report available on website.

Successful convention season - New pricing structure and expansion of recovery literature and merchandise
yielded increases in item sales and transactions. Steady sales numbers YOY for BDSC, significant increase
in sales at Spring Roundup. More details available in full report.

Central Office Report (continued)

- These convention item and transaction sales increases translate into more recovery literature and merchandise in the hands of more recovering alcoholics, and that is a ripple effect we are happy and grateful to be part of.
- Service Board Inventory We heard out the voices present from our fellowship and have begun processing those comments to bring our office's contribution to a collective contribution leading to a list of goals for the future of the office and our board.
- Website Content Updates Found Service Board Google Drive that hadn't been regularly updated in a few years. To provide info for questions from the Inventory about job descriptions, elections info, etc., we added several documents from this GNOSB Google Drive to the Service Board & Central Office page of our website, including the most recent job descriptions we could find for Service Board officers, committee chairs, and Central Office Manager. In May, we added to the Contributions page, 2024 home group contributions and 2025 home group contributions to date.

Lynn W. And Tara C. brought up concerns about Central Office carrying Al-Anon literature, and whether doing so harms the local Al-Anon Central Office. Discussion followed. Jim N. motioned to table the discussion for the next meeting.

Ad Hoc Committee: Big Deep South Financials - Jim N. We will have a report to present for this committee at the next board meeting, following the Big Deep South Inventory.

D20: Colyn N. (DCM) - Quiet time of year; many members are university students. Need a PI/CPC chair.

D21: Sarah P. (DCM) - Outlining guidelines; had a Traditions, Sex, and Relationships workshop (60+ attendees); placed an ad on the radio; funded outreach to Angola; will rent van again to bring D21 GSRs to Area meeting. Buttons coming soon.

D17: absent | **D18:** No report. | **D25:** absent – Central Office manager will reach out to re-invite these districts.

New Business

Ad Hoc Subcommittee to Update By-Laws & Guidelines. Recommended for new board to do. GNOSB Committees. Committee positions open, TBD at next month's meeting. Consideration of revamping committees that hadn't had a committee chairperson.

Tradition Seven Checklist from A.A. Grapevine

Long Form: The A.A. groups themselves ought to be fully supported by the voluntary contributions of their own members. We think that each group should soon achieve this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds using the name of Alcoholics Anonymous is highly dangerous, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other outside agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from any source, or of contributions carrying any obligation whatever, is unwise. Then, too, we view with much concern those A.A. treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves to accumulate funds for no stated A.A. purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money, and authority.

- 1. Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new person who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when drunk in a barroom?
- 2. How do I (or my group) support our International Journals of Alcoholics Anonymous, Grapevine and La Vina?
- 3. Should the Grapevine sell advertising space to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?
- 4. If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be OK to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?
- 5. Is it more important for a group to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?
- 6. Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- 7. Does my group have a "prudent reserve"? If yes, do I know what that amount is?
- 8. If a family member, work colleague or close friend who is not an AA member wants to make a financial contribution to my group, should the group accept it? What if my group is short on funds?
- 9. How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received?

Concept VII Checklist from G.S.O.

Long Form: The Conference recognizes that the Charter and the Bylaws of the General Service Board are legal instruments: that the Trustees are thereby fully empowered to manage and conduct all of the world service affairs of Alcoholics Anonymous. It is further understood that the Conference Charter itself is not a legal document: that it relies instead upon the force of tradition and the power of the A.A. purse for its final effectiveness.
