Summary From Service Board Meeting - November 20, 2025

Highlights

- Discussion about when to discuss more in-depth the results of the Service Board Inventory from June 2025
 - Hadn't been enough time at meetings since the new board Trustees took office in July 2025, so the Chairperson was calling for when to schedule additional meetings to have these discussions
 - Feedback from attendees was that now that the fiscal year budget was passed, there would be more time to review different points of the inventory during the usual monthly board meetings
- Discussion about ways to generate revenue to help balance the Service Board fiscal year budget's projected deficit
 - Central Office manager and attendees shared various ideas to generate awareness and enthusiasm around Central Office and the GNO Service Board, as well as generating revenue

Motions

- Motion to launch Central Office Hours survey form, with each individual's submission as an entry to a drawing for a \$25 gift card to Central Office
 - Passed with substantial unanimity

- Electricity (for crockpots, bounce house), if possible (otherwise will source a generator)

Tradition Twelve Checklist from A.A. Grapevine

Long Form: And finally, we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all.

- 1. Why is it a good idea for me to place the common welfare of all AA members before individual welfare? What would happen to me if AA as a whole disappeared?
- 2. When I do not trust AA's current servants, who do I wish had the authority to straighten them out?
- 3. In my opinions of and remarks about other AAs, am I implying membership requirements other than a desire to stay sober?
- 4. Do I ever try to get a certain AA group to conform to my standards, not its own?
- 5. Have I a personal responsibility in helping an AA group fulfill its primary purpose? What is my part?
- 6. Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition or belie it?
- 7. Do I do all I can do to support AA financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine subscription?
- 8. Do I complain about certain AAs' behavior especially if they are paid to work for AA? Who made me so smart?
- 9. Do I fulfill all AA responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
- 10. Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give AA critics real ammunition?
- 11. Should I keep my AA membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of AA so attractive that other drunks want it?
- 12. What is the real importance of me among more than a million AAs?
- 13. What does anonymity mean to me?
- 14. In light of increased awareness of alcoholism and AA's program of recovery among the general public, why is the principle of anonymity still important?
- 15. Am I mindful to respect the anonymity of other AA members who may work in my place of employment or my industry? How about AA members who live in my area or neighborhood?
- 16. What does "principles before personalities" mean to me?

Concept XII Checklist from G.S.O.

Long Form: General Warranties of the Conference: in all its proceedings, the General Service Conference shall observe the spirit of the A.A. Tradition, taking great care that the Conference never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds, plus an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principle; that none of the Conference Members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any of the others; that all important decisions be reached by discussion, vote, and whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy; that, though the Conference may act for the service of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of governments; and that, like the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in thought and action.

Major Release - 5.0

Version 5.0 of Meeting Guide was released on October 10, 2025. This release includes the following significant updates:

Dedicated Online Meeting Finder Tab

With Version 5.0, members now have the ability to search specifically for online meetings without being limited by their current geographic location.

For those who want to attend online A.A. meetings, the new Online tab makes it easier to:

- Discover a wider variety of meetings across time zones and regions
- · Find meetings that best fit their preferences
- Access online options beyond their immediate local area

The Online tab includes:

- Worldwide Listings: A global list of upcoming online meetings
- Expanded Filter Options: A wider set of meeting filters is available, including new options relevant to online meetings.
- Device Timezone Support: Meetings in this tab are displayed in the member's device timezone

Meeting Guide continues to provide a combined listing of local in-person and online meetings. Because they can be attended both online and in person, hybrid meetings appear in both the geographic listing and the Online tab.



12 Ways Grapevine Helps with our daily 12th step work



- 1. AA PREAMBLE Used for meetings all over the world, it was written by an editor of the Grapevine and first appeared in the June 1947 issue.
- 2. THE SERENITY PRAYER Began appearing in early Grapevines as it moved into general AA use.
- 3. THE RESPONSIBILITY DECLARATION Written by another Grapevine editor for the 1965 convention in Toronto, it went on to become a staple expression of AA purpose.



- FIVE SLOGANS Used by AA meetings everywhere, they first appeared in their well-known graphic form in five issues of the Grapevine in 1956 and 1957.
- 5. THE TWELVE TRADITIONS In the early 1950s, our co-founder Bill W. hammered out our Twelve Traditions in the pages of the Grapevine.
- 6. A PLACE TO TELL YOUR STORY Send us your story! Take a look at the magazine to get some ideas. It's easy! Go to www.aagrapevine.org/share. We want to hear from you!
- **SOURCE OF AA HISTORY** For decades, Grapevine has published a variety of articles which reflect the early history of AA, including the writings of our cofounder Bill W. for Grapevine which can be found in their en-tirety in *The Language of the Heart*. Our Story Archive holds hundreds of articles by our earliest members back to 1944.

- 8. A LINK WITH THE COMMUNITY AT LARGE If your group, district, area or country needs help or wants to know how groups operate, there are others who may have found solutions and have shared their experience in the Grapevine. See how others do it!
- 9. A MONTHLY 12TH STEP TOOL Does your group bring meetings into jails and institutions? Grapevines that reach members behind walls are greatly appreciated. You can also bring a magazine to professionals (lawyers, doctors, judges, etc) to help them better understand our program.
- 10. A PLACE TO SHARE YOUR OPINION Do you have an idea you would like to share? Is there something you would like to get off your chest? Grapevine offers you a "podium" to communicate your thoughts to a wide audience within AA.
- 11. IT'S OUR MEETING IN PRINT Grapevine is an ideal solution for those on the road or in the air or who cannot attend regular meetings. The magazine can be read like a meeting, starting with the Preamble, then reading the different stories and ending with the Serenity Prayer. There's even a monthly discussion question!
- 12. A PERFECT GIFT Give Grapevine to a newcomer, a friend or a fellow in AA. A subscription to the Grapevine, whether it be for a year or two, is a great way to get to know AA better. It is also a great sober anniversary gift!
